### Shelter & Water Sanitation – Première Urgence-Aide Médicale Internationale (PU-AMI)

#### Shelter Repair and Upgrade - Palestinian Gatherings in Lebanon € 691 000

The objective of the project is to improve the living conditions of Palestinian refugees in Lebanon by raising the shelters conditions of the most vulnerable Palestinians refugees to acceptable standards. The vulnerable Palestinian refugees of Bustan Abu Jamil, Hay El Cinema (in Saida) and Borj El Barajneh (in Beirut) gatherings will benefit from adequate shelter conditions. The improvement of access to clean water and appropriate sanitation conditions is the second objective of this project, from which the inhabitants of Bustan Abu Jamil, Hay El Sohoun and Fadel Wakim will benefit. This will be achieved through the construction of new water supply networks and the rehabilitation of sewage networks.

### Health – Netherlands Red cross (NLRC) € 525 000

The objective of this project is the improvement of secondary health care services for Palestinian refugees provided by Palestine Red Crescent Society/Lebanon for Palestinian Refugees in Lebanon.

The main results of this project will be:

- Improved health of the most vulnerable Palestinian Refugees
- Improved secondary healthcare in the 5 PRCS/L Hospitals in Lebanon
- Increased access of poor and vulnerable to the 5 PRCS/L hospitals
- Improved quality of medical services in and management of the PRCS/L hospitals

- Increased in volumes of trade in NBC thanks to Cash-transfers to beneficiaries

### Protection/Health - UNRWA € 214 251

Protection of Palestine refugees in Lebanon – Phase III

The objectives of the project are:

- Enhancement of the respect, protection, and fulfilment of rights of Palestinian refugees in Lebanon
- Enhanced protection of Palestinian refugees through advocacy on Palestinians' rights, community outreach and Lebanese public awareness on Palestinians living conditions in Lebanon
- Improved access of Palestinian refugees to legal aid through legal counselling and representation services through a referral system
- Better understanding of Palestinian refugees and UNRWA's mandate by the Lebanese public through an extended public advocacy campaign and related outreach activities.

### Relief assistance, Shelter and Water 7 sanitation - Gruppo Volontariato Civile (G. V. C.) Winterisation package for under-served Syrian families in the Bekaa Valley € 400 000

The project will provide emergency assistance - in the framework of winterisation process - to Syrian families and host communities living in dire conditions in Masharih el Qaa in the Bekaa Valley. Emergency access to basic services as winterisation of shelters, safe water and sanitation, and essential goods to Syrian families and host communities in targeted area will be ensured.

### Protection (GBV) and mental health - International rescue Committee (IRC) Supporting Syrian Refugee Women and Girls Protection and Mental Health € 1 700 000

Ensured prevention and response services for vulnerable Syrian refugee women and girls and survivors of gender-based violence (GBV).

Access of Syrian refugees and survivors of GBV in Jordan, Lebanon and Iraq- in urban and camp settings when existing- to coordinated specialised, comprehensive, confidential and quality response services in addition to material and financial support to reduce further risks of violence.

### Shelter & winterisation – Norwegian Refugee Council (NRC) Support to people escaping the armed conflict in Syrian and seeking refuge in Neighbouring countries € 3 000 000

The project aims at improving access of Syrian refugees in neighbouring countries to emergency preparedness operations (winterisation), adequate shelter solutions, information and protection.

The project will result in

- Enhanced shelter condition in Lebanon to cope with the winter weather and rehabilitation of shelters up to adequate standards
- The provision of recreational, educational and information/counselling services inside the NRC community Centres in Lebanon
- The access to adequate shelter provision through non-food-items distribution and winterisation in Zaatari camp and host community shelter upgrade in Jordan.

**Water, Hygiene & Sanitation – Action Contre la Faim (ACF)**  
**Humanitarian Water, Hygiene & Sanitation response in support to the population affected by the unrest in Syria**  
**€ 1 000 000**

This project will contribute to reduce the impact of the crisis and improve the living conditions of the affected population by the unrest in Syria. It will improve the personal and environmental hygiene practices of the target population in Syria and reduced the risk of water borne infectious diseases.

The actions will also aim at better access to safe potable water in terms of quantity and quality and adequate hygiene and sanitation facilities at household level.

**Relief assistance and winterisation - AVSI**  
**Emergency intervention in support of Syrian conflict affected population during winter in Jordan and Lebanon**  
**€ 270 000**

Saving and protecting the lives of Syrian refugees during winter season in Jordan and Lebanon is the objective of this action. The project will support the affected population with non-food-items to improve their living conditions during the cold season in Lebanon and Jordan.

**Shelter – water & sanitation - Première Urgence-Aide Médicale Internationale (PU-AMI) Emergency support to unrest-affected population in Syria and neighbouring countries**  
**€ 2 800 000**

Through the provision of life-saving integrated assistance, this programme aims at saving the lives of vulnerable people in Syria and neighbouring countries, affected by the violence in Syria,

The access to basic goods and items for the most vulnerable unrest-affected people will help to maintain their health and dignity. The access to safe housing and hygienic sanitation facilities will improve their living conditions.

**Health and rehabilitation – Handicap International Federation (HI)**  
**Emergency intervention for the most vulnerable people affected by the Syrian crisis - phase II**  
**€ 1 800 000**

This programme will help mitigating the impact of the Syrian crisis on the most vulnerable persons and their families - including Syrian injured refugees and other vulnerable groups - by responding to their basic and specific needs.

The actions will aim at improving physical & mental health and reducing vulnerability of the most vulnerable people amongst the refugee population in Lebanon and Jordan.

**Relief assistance and winterisation – Terre Des Hommes Lausannes (TdH-CH)**  
**Emergency support to people affected by the Syrian crisis**  
**€ 500 000**

Through the provision of hygiene and cash support to displaced refugees through the winter months, this programme will improve living conditions of the affected population.

**Relief assistance and winterisation – Danish refugee Council (DRC)**  
**This mayor programme provides emergency assistance to conflict and displacement affected population in Syria and the neighbouring countries.**  
**€ 7 100 000**

Respond to the immediate needs of conflict and displacement-affected population in Syria and neighboring countries.

Improved access to essential non-food-items and living conditions of affected population in conflict and displacement areas in Syria, Lebanon and Jordan

**Food assistance – World Food Program (WFP)**  
**Emergency Food Assistance to People Affected by Unrest in Syria and increased support to the humanitarian operations**  
**€ 18 600 000**

The main objective of this extensive programme is to save lives and to protect livelihoods in emergencies.

It also aims at preventing food insecurity for people affected by the unrest and at an improved inter-agency logistics coordination and information management in support to the humanitarian community.

The result will be a improved food consumption and food security in terms of quantity and quality of emergency-affected households (through food and vouchers distribution) in Syria, Lebanon, Jordan and Iraq.

**Protection – United Nations High Commission fro refugees (UNHCR)**  
**Support to displaced Syrians in neighbouring countries, and to affected population in Syria**  
**€ 18 300 000**

This programme will contribute to improving the living conditions of Syrians fleeing violence in Syria and provide individuals and families fleeing violence in Syria with multi-sectorial assistance in Syria and neighboring countries.

The action will also strengthen multi-sectorial assistance (including registration, health care, non-food-items, shelter support where possible) to displaced families in Syria and refugees in Lebanon, Jordan, Iraq and Turkey.

**Relief assistance, protection and health care – UNRWA**  
**Emergency Assistance to displaced Palestine refugees from Syria in Lebanon**  
**€ 500 000**

The action will respond to emergency needs of Palestine refugees from Syria in Lebanon. Activities will include emergency health support (basic, secondary and tertiary healthcare) as well as coordination and protection (to the overall response and prevention and reduction to their physical safety and security) to the displaced Palestine refugees from Syria in Lebanon. This will result in putting in place contingency measures to provide emergency assistance to additional Palestine refugees fleeing Syria into Lebanon.

### Food and relief assistance – Terre Des Hommes Italy (TdH-IT) Provision of Food and Non-food Items needed to face primary needs and the upcoming winter to Palestinian refugees from Syria in Lebanon € 819 000

The response to the basic needs of the Palestinian refugees fleeing from Syria in Palestinian camps and Gatherings and their surroundings in Lebanon is the mayor goal of this project. It will result in an improved access to basic food items (through distribution of vouchers) and non-food items needed to better cope with the cold to the Palestinian Refugees from Syria provisionally hosted in Palestinian Refugee camps and Gatherings in Lebanon.

Contingency measures and a rapid response plan will be put in place to maximise the access of humanitarian aid through the distribution of emergency non-food-items and networking with other INGOs.

### Support to Syrian displaced in Lebanon € 1 300 000

Implemented by: UN agencies - Direct Management

In December 2012, the Government of Italy, through the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, allocated two funds, respectively of Euro 500.000 in favour of UNHCR and Euro 300.000 in favor UNICEF through multilateral channel and for the implementation of the Syrian Regional Response Plan (RRP). In particular, the contribution to UNHCR allows the implementation of a part of the UN Refugee agency WASH strategy. The allocation to UNICEF is functional to carrying out a child protection project in favour of Syrian and Lebanese children. This fund follows a previous grant of Euro 500.000 allocated in favour of UNICEF in July 2012 aimed to implement education and child protection interventions and a humanitarian flight delivered in December 2011 aimed at the distribution of non-food items (NFIs). This contribution is part of the so far 7.5 million Euro response of Italy to the Syrian crisis in the region; during 2013 the allocation of additional funding to UN and the creation of direct managed interventions are expected to take place.

### Support to aid projects to the Syrian refugees and the host communities € 410 000

The continued fleeing of Syrian refugees to Lebanon requires providing support to the refugees' aid structures on the one hand, and to the local population affected by the Syrian crisis on the other. In 2012/2013, France has funded many projects implemented by the Lebanese government, local and international NGOs as well as the UNHCR.

Eight projects were funded for a total of 410 000 Euros (excluding the contributions of the French government to the UNHCR and other UN agencies in Lebanon and the region). These projects respond to the basic needs of vulnerable refugees and host population: food assistance, access to healthcare, educational activities for children, rehabilitation of two community centres, access to water and winterisation. The structures that received funding are: the UNHCR, the High Relief Lebanese Committee, Amel associations, Save the Children, Première Urgence-Aide Médicale Internationale, Handicap International, Doctors of the World and Caritas.

### WASH Emergency intervention to affected population by the Syrian conflict in Bekaa Valley (May 2012- June 2012) € 105 852

The objective of the project is providing shelter, access to adequate water, sanitation facilities and hygiene promotion to the Syrian refugees in Bekaa. Beneficiaries have been selected according to their vulnerability: priority has been given to displaced families living in unfinished houses or rented apartments in precarious conditions and overcrowded spaces. Women and elderly people held households have been prioritised, as well as families with small children. The selection of beneficiaries was performed in coordination with the Municipalities (especially with Aarsal, North Bekaa). In particular:

- Water tanks were distributed further to household visits to assess water storage needs;
- Distribution of water with trucks was planned after field visits to assess water needs and in cooperation with the different municipalities;
- Distribution of water filters were made after field assessments and in cooperation with the municipalities.
